Record growth funding for schools \$200m to create 80,000 new apprenticeships \$62m foundation skills pilot program for remote areas

What does this mean?

This budget promises to provide much needed support for youth mental health and education, but it doesn't effectively address some of the key issues that impact young Australians.

These include housing affordability and availability, underemployment, youth homelessness and the cost of living.
