The event is specifically designed for individuals working with young people aged 12-25 years including professionals from local government, government and the community sector.

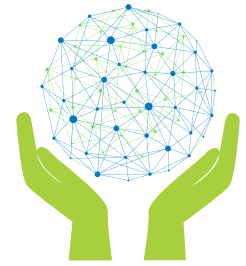

Associate Professor Dr. Tim Corney PhD (Melb), MA (RMIT), BA (Deakin), BA (Youth Work).



Dr Tim Corney is a leading authority on the professionalisation of youth work. He is currently an Associate Professor in the College of Education at Victoria University and Principal Research Fellow and Discipline Leader of Youth and Community Research. Tim has published widely on youth affairs and professional youth work and lectured in the youth work degree programs at RMIT University, the Australian Catholic University and Victoria University. Tim is currently partnering with professional youth work associations from around the world including: Youth Workers Association of Estonia, NAPOR Serbian National Association of Youth Workers; Institute for Social Research in Zagreb (Croatia); European Youth Card Association (Bulgaria); Youth Researchers, University of Iceland; Finnish Youth Research Society - FYRN (Finland); Icelandic Association of Youth Workers.

Commissioner for Children and Young People Tasmania - Leanne McLean



Leanne McLean is a Tasmanian from the deep south of the state. She was appointed Tasmania's Commissioner for Children and Young People in November 2018. Her role is to promote the rights and wellbeing of Tasmanian children and young people—including ensuring that their rights are considered and respected by adults when making decisions that may affect children. Leanne has a wealth of experience as a leader in social policy development, including working at the coal face with young people and in senior public service and government advisory roles. As Commissioner, her work to date includes instigating the Tasmanian Government's forthcoming strategy to improve the wellbeing of Tasmania's children and young people, establishing mechanisms for children and young people to have a say in matters that are impacting on them, working with young Tasmanians across the state to influence the development, implementation and communication of policies which affect them, and empowering them to shape their own future. Leanne is passionate about providing a voice for children and young people, believes strongly in the transformative power of education and early intervention, and the value of every young person in shaping the future of Tasmania.
